The new and the old mix easily in Lancaster County, PA

Lancaster County is an appealing and diverse destination for visitors, offering not only our Amish history, but a thriving & hip downtown, wonderful family attractions, walkable small towns, various recreational activities, and a wide array of dining & lodging venues. It's everything you expect, and everything you didn't!



Home to the nation's original & largest Amish settlement, we have several interpretive attractions to explore, plus buggy rides and personalized tour options (https://www.discoverlancaster.com/amish/).

Travelers can also discover other parts of our **rich history**, such as railroading at the <u>Strasburg Rail Road</u> and the <u>Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania</u>, our Pennsylvania German history at the <u>Landis Valley Village & Farm Museum</u>, and the home of U.S. President James Buchanan at <u>Wheatland Mansion</u>.

Some of our other fun family attractions that are always popular include top-rated <u>Dutch Wonderland</u> amusement park, <u>Turkey Hill Experience</u>, <u>Cherry Crest Adventure Farm</u>, the <u>Lancaster Science Factory</u> and the <u>North Museum of Nature & Science</u>, and <u>Lancaster Stormers baseball</u>.

In surprising contrast to our famous farmlands is historic yet hip **downtown Lancaster City** (www.visitlancastercity.com), with a robust art gallery community, performing arts venues like the Fulton Theatre and the Ware Center, three upscale hotels, a symphony & opera, museums, national Top 25 indie shopping, a modern convention center, fine dining (as well as the nation's oldest farmers market), and entertaining nightlife.

Lancaster County boasts an abundance of **outdoor activities** as well. Go <u>ziplining</u> at Refreshing Mountain, <u>kayaking or paddle boarding</u> down the Susquehanna River, or running or bicycling through our countryside. How 'bout <u>hiking</u> at Chickies Rock or Tucquan Glen, or <u>horseback riding</u> at Stone Gables Estate? Or tee it up at one of our fine public courses, like <u>Pilgrim's Oak</u> in Peach Bottom, <u>Crossgates</u> in Millersville, <u>Foxchase</u> in Stevens.

Variety is the spice of life when it comes to **dining out** in Lancaster, from our traditional PA Dutch favorites & smorgasbord offerings, to fun eateries like <u>Loxley's</u> treehouse-themed property and <u>DJ's Taste of the '50s</u>, to upscale venues like <u>401 Prime</u> and <u>Log Cabin</u>. **Wines and brews** are also big here, with a number of high-quality vineyards that cater to visitors, the largest craft brewery contingent in the state, and other great libation locations like <u>Conway Social Club</u> and <u>Bulls Head Pub</u>.

The county is full of charming, walkable **small towns** with home-grown stores & eats, such as the delicious history of <u>Lititz</u>, antiquing in <u>Adamstown</u> & <u>Columbia</u>, <u>Kitchen Kettle Village</u> & other shops in <u>Intercourse</u>, and lively downtown <u>Ephrata</u>.

With so much to do, you'll want to stay over and there are plenty of **lodging options** to choose from: large-scale properties like the <u>Eden Resort & Suites</u> or the <u>DoubleTree Resort Lancaster</u>; quality hotels like the <u>Bird-in-Hand Family Inn</u> or <u>The Inn at Hershey Farm Resort</u>; historic venues like the <u>Lancaster Arts Hotel</u>; and numerous <u>B&Bs</u>, <u>farmstays</u>, and <u>campgrounds</u> (some with cottage rentals).
